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I have to admit that I had never come across anything like a Spanish breakfast before. The most known are, after all, the British, German and American types. I did some quick research and it turned out that the Spaniards like to have their breakfast light in order to leave a significant amount of space for a huge lunch. Which suits Rone's album, as it is somewhat a prelude to similarly tasting but slightly more nourishing meals à la James Holden, Nathan Pato, Matias or Outbreaks.

The French producer's music is melodious, soft and pleasant, and the album picks up pace only at times, as can be heard on the brilliant and bled with aggression track 'La Dame Blanche', or the somewhat calmer tune entitled 'Dixie Amal'. Nonetheless, in its majority the piece is a like a breakfast on grass, and a soundtrack to shaping clouds through the eyes of your imagination. Particularly beautiful are Rone's known from Agents' 'At The Controls' and 'Poison Pilot'. If it wasn't for the weather outside, these tracks could motivate me to go out with 'Spanish Breakfast' and spend the day sitting by a meadow.
